Dear Caity,
The World Heritage Centre acknowledged the proposal sent by the State Party of the United Kingdom to propose a modification for the boundaries of the World Heritage property of Durham Castle and Cathedral, inscribed on the World Heritage List in 1986.
This proposal, made in the context of the follow-up of the first cycle of Periodic Reporting, was transmitted to ICOMOS international for review. Considering the extension presented, our Advisory Body will evaluate whether the changes proposed could be considered as a minor or a significant modification (a minor modification will be presented into the documents and Committee's decisions for approval. In case the extension is considered as a significant modification, the process will be different, as the site should be considered as a new nomination (full cycle for evaluation).

The World Heritage Centre will inform the State Party as soon as we receive the evaluation and comments made by ICOMOS on this issue.

Clarification on the boundaries of the Durham World Heritage Site was provided to the World Heritage Centre in the Framework of the Retrospective Inventory Project by a letter from Peter Marsden to Mr Bandarin on 30 November 2007. A request for a minor modification to the boundaries, which included maps of the existing and proposed extension to the inscribed site, together with a revised Statement of Significance, was further submitted to the World Heritage Centre on 31 January 2008 again from Peter Marsden to Mr Bandarin, in the context of the follow-up to the European Periodic Reporting on the application of the World Heritage Convention.

I confirm you that the World Heritage Centre received the management plan for the World Heritage property of Durham Castle and Cathedral inscribed in 1986 on the World Heritage List. It was transmitted to ICOMOS international for review and comments too.

However, we noted at this stage that the boundaries of the property indicated in this management plan do not correspond to the actual boundaries approved by the World Heritage Committee. Therefore, the management plan is not based on the "correct" property. Your State Party should consider sending to the World Heritage Centre a modified map for review by ICOMOS and for approval by the World Heritage Committee.
