I am due to attend a Tower of London World Heritage Site Consultative Committee meeting next Wednesday, 27th February and have been asked to report on progress on the review of the Tower of London Management Plan by the World Heritage Centre and ICOMOS [[Decision 31COM 7B.91 para 8](#)].

First, I would be grateful if you can let me know what progress there has been on the review and what the formal process is. My understanding is that when the WH centre and ICOMOS have completed their review, a report will be made to the Committee at its 32nd session. What is not entirely clear is whether the State Party will see the draft report in advance of the Committee meeting (other than in circulated Committee papers) and have an opportunity to comment.

Second, is it usual practice for the State Party to have communication with the Advisory Body and/or the WH Centre during the review process? I know that colleagues at the Tower of London were keen to enter into a dialogue with ICOMOS but we strongly discouraged this. However, I would be grateful if you could let me know whether the Tower and ICOMOS or the Centre have been in discussion about the review.

Grateful for some clarification on the above points so that I can report back to the Consultative Committee, many of whom are not familiar with either the World Heritage process or the Operational Guidelines.
